In last weekend's JV tournament we just barely lost our first game, against IC, by the slim margin of 13-15. Lilly scored 7 points, and Linda, 6. In our next game we were up against St. Mary's; this game ended in a score of HC15 to St. Mary's 24. Lilly scored 8 of those points; Lizzie, 3, and Linda and Calista each added 2 more points. Thank you to Coach Wolf for introducing our young ladies to basketball!

Our Varsity girls' first tournament game last night found us victorious against Trinity with a score of 40-25. Scorer were Mackenzie with 12 points, Kylie with 10, Amy and Veronica, 4 each, and Marissa, Natalie, Julia and Sarah, 2 points each. Our next game is 7pm tonight against MCA for a chance to play for first place in the finals! Hope to see everyone there--go, girls!

From the Varsity Girls' Coach:

"It has been a great year and we are seeded 3rd in the tournament this week.

"A summary of the last four weeks...on Sep. 24 we hosted MCA and, although it was another close game, we suffered our 2nd loss of the season with a score of 17-14. Scorer were Kylie with 9 points, Mackenzie and Amy with 2 each, with Julia adding 1 more: great effort, girls! On the 25th, we traveled to St. Mary's. It was a well

fought game, and we were victorious with a score of 17-13. Scorer were Kylie with 10 points, Mackenzie with 5 and Julia with 2. On Sep. 29 St. A's came to our house and handed us our 3rd loss of the season: although we fought hard, we came up short by a score of 20-17. There were a lot of contributors to this game: Kylie had 4 points, Mackenzie added 2, Amy had 4, Natalie was the high scorer with 6 and Julia added 2 points to finish the scoring. On Oct. 1 we hosted St. A's and our entire team had an off night: we could put up only 5 points to their 26. Scoring were: Mackenzie with 3 and Julia with 2. (This game was our 4th—and last—loss of the season.) On Oct. 8 we welcomed St. Mary's to our gym and due to a great defensive effort we came out on top with a score of 19-10. The scorers for this win were: Kylie with 9, Mackenzie with 4, Julia added 4, and Veronica finished the scoring with 2. On Oct. 15 we went to IC and won by a score of 22-15. Scorer were: Mackenzie with 2, Veronica, Amy and Julia each added 4, and Kylie added 8. Our last game of the regular season found us at Trinity, where we added another win to our record (with a score of 29-12). Scorer were many: MacKenzie had 4, Kylie had 7, Marissa added 2, high scorer Julia had 9 followed by Veronica with 2, Kiley had her season high with 4, and Sarah scored a free throw.

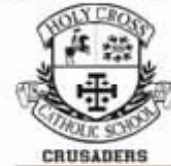
