Financial Aid for Next Year

Your "PSAS" application for the Archdiocesan grant must be postmarked by next Friday!! If you don't already have a copy, call the school office to have an application sent home with your child, or stop in to pick one up. You may also download the form from the Archdiocese's website: go to www.aodonline.org; "Catholic Schools" from the left, then "Tuition Assistance" "Parents under and Students," "Archdiocesan Endowment Tuition Assistance Programs," then select the form and instruction letter.

Application forms are also available for the "Father Bartone / Blue Water Vicariate" grants--call if you need one.

Blue Jeans for Books

As you may have noticed, on the first day of the week the school staff is often 'out of uniform.' It has come to my attention that I haven't explained why. We participate in a program we call "Blue Jeans for Books." Staff members pay for the privilege of a casual Monday.
