27 families (that's about 40% of our total number of families!) just shared over \$30,000 in tuition grants from the Archdiocese of Detroit and the Fathers Bartone and Sadler funds!

Statements (including bills for camp) went out over the weekend; if you haven't received yours yet please contact the school office. School families on the monthly payment plan will be paying their 8<sup>th</sup> of 10 monthly payments by the end of December; those on the quarterly plan will owe their third (25%) payment by January 20. Preschool families: your November 28 payment should have put your tuition account at the "half-paid" mark, with your next payment due Dec. 28.
