"Fifth Disease"

We've recently had a confirmed case of this mild illness. According to the Health Department, fifth disease begins about a week after exposure with a low-grade fever that lasts 5-7 days, possibly followed by a rash on the face, trunk, arms and legs that resembles a slapped cheek. (Adults may notice joint pain and swelling at this point.) By the time the characteristic rash appears on the cheeks, the illness is no longer contagious; the child may return to school when he feels well and when there is no fever.

FLU SEASON

The flu season is upon us once again and it is important to follow these preventative actions to stop the spread of germs:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.

Wash your hands OFTEN with soap and warm water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.

Try to avoid close contact with sick people.

If you are sick with flu-like symptoms, stay home (keep your child home) until you/they are fever free without the use of a fever-reducing medicine for a full 24 hours.

While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible.
