Archdiocesan Grants

The application can be found on the website of the Archdiocese of Detroit: www.aodonline.org: go to "Catholic Schools," then "Tuition Assistance" and scroll down to the middle of the page-you should see an English and Spanish version of the application.

On the front page of the application there is a box for a "school label." You may DISREGARD this box: there IS NO school label for Holy Cross.

A reminder to save copies of your PSAS form: you'll need it to apply for all other Holy Cross tuition assistance.

- 1. Correspondence: Thank you card from Mrs. Sweet to the PTO for all the hard work done this year. Several brochures passed on to PTO President for PTO consideration.
- 2. Principals Report (read by Mrs. Senger): March 6th open house: many events are planned, including a new school brochure to be sent out, a drawing for a 50% of tuition for one student (new) and also a drawing for established students to enter for the same discount. Students who wear their Holy Cross uniforms to the event will receive a free dress down day coupon. March 23rd: accreditation kick off meet and greet; all are encouraged to attend.
