Congratulations to our awesome SCRIP crew! They made 2012 a banner year, with sales in excess of \$1,220,000!! In their words:

"The total sales for the year of 2012 were another record setting total of \$1,222,841.53. The following are some of the places that have earned the benefits of this program: Holy Cross families received \$19,158.15 towards their tuition; Cardinal Mooney families received \$10,601.34; Religious Education families, \$4,528.5. Flu!

Influenza is big in the news these days. We have had no confirmed cases here at school but thought it wise to pass on the CDC's advice on protecting your family against flu:

"Get a seasonal flu vaccine. Take everyday steps to prevent the spread of viruses: cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, and throw all tissues in the trash after being used. Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. (If soap and water are not available, alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.) Avoid touching your eves, nose and mouth: germs spread this way. Teach your children to take thee actions, too. Try to keep your child from having close contact (about 6 feet) with sick people, including anyone in the sick. household who is Disinfect household surfaces according to the directions on the disinfectant's label."
