Archdiocesan Grant Forms

The application forms for the Archdiocese of Detroit's tuition grants for 2013-14 are available—call the school if you'd like a paper copy send home with your student. (The forms are processed by a company known as PSAS.)

You can also find the form and directions on the website of the Archdiocese of Detroit: www.aod.org. Go to "Schools," click on "Tuition Assistance and Scholarships," then "Private School Aid" to find the PSAS application and directions.

This year, the applications must be received by PSAS before April 8, and there is a \$20 fee. Do NOT send your application for this award to school—it needs to be mailed to the address for PSAS listed in the information.

Academic Olympics

Parents of 5th-8th graders have probably been seeing "interest surveys" and other "permission forms" regarding Academic Olympics. The Olympiad is a collection of competitions among our local Catholic schools. Students can compete in "Forensics," "Problem Solving," "Math," and "Religion Quiz Bowl," pitting themselves against students in their grade at other nearby schools.

The contests will be held on Saturday, February 23 at St. Augustine School in Richmond. A schedule of events will be given to all participating students as the event draws nearer, with the first competitions beginning at 9am and the last, at noon.

The Academic Olympics is a lot of fun, and with some individual and some team events there's room for everyone.
