#### **Archdiocesan Grants**

The application forms for the Archdiocese of Detroit's tuition grants for 2013-14 are available—call the school if you'd like a paper copy sent home with your child. (The forms are processed by a company known as PSAS.)

You can also find the form and directions on the website of the Archdiocese of Detroit: <a href="www.aod.org">www.aod.org</a>. Go to "Schools," click on "Tuition Assistance and Scholarships," then "Private School Aid" to find the PSAS application and directions.

This year, the applications must be received by PSAS <u>before April 8</u>, and there is a \$20 fee to apply. Do NOT send your application for this award to school—it needs to be mailed to the address for PSAS listed in the information.

Remember to save a copy of your application—you must have applied for this Archdiocesan aid to be considered for any other assistance.

They studied the choices made by George Washington, John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Madison. They learned about how all of the presidents contributed to the building of America. ### Parent Notification & Opt-Out

Dear Parent or Guardian,

The Michigan Attorney General's office will be conducting Internet safety presentations for Holy Cross students in grades K - 8 on Wednesday, April 10, 2013.

The kindergarten through first-grade and second through third-grade presentations include a video of the acclaimed book *Faux Paw's Adventures in the Internet*. The primary focus is to emphasize students should: keep safe by not sharing any personal information, keep away from Internet strangers, and keep telling parents or a trusted adult about anything that makes them feel uncomfortable. The second through third-grade presentation includes a second Faux Paw video about cyber bullying.

In addition to the keep safe, keep away, and keep telling messages, students in fourth grade and above also learn about common tricks Internet predators use and appropriate responses to cyber harassment. Fourth through fifth-grade students watch a realistic fiction video entitled "Predator" provided compliments of the nonprofit group I-SAFE Inc.

Sixth through eighth-grade students see two videos based on the stories of actual teenage Internet predator victims and are cautioned about revealing personal information on social networking sites. Additionally, sixth through eighth-grade students learn the consequences of sexting and bullying and are advised to think before sending pictures or text messages, know the consequences, and protect their reputation and their future. These students also see a video that features cyber bullying suicide victims.
