SPECIAL INCENTIVE FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FAMILIES

In April, the school committee adopted an enrollment enhancement plan that has been implemented by a couple of our Catholic school neighbors. In an effort to make a Holy Cross education for parish families enrolled in the C.C.D. program more accessible, these families were invited to enroll their child at Holy Cross at a low introductory rate for 2012-2013. You already know that Holy Cross is an exceptionally healthy environment for a child's education. Currently, Our Lady on the River parish pays over \$7,000.00 per child to educate each the children currently enrolled at Holy Cross. Knowing that, it is easy to see that each school family currently gets a deep discount from the parish. We have a wonderful school and want to share it with as many families as possible. It would be great if you could help bring your parish friends to the school for next year.
