Basketball

Our only game this week was Tuesday evening at St. Mary St. Clair. The JV game ended in a score of HC 13, SM 24. Holy Cross's girls won the hotly contested Varsity game in overtime, with a final score of 31-28. Lilly Wolf led in scoring with 19 points, Beki Schultz added 8 and Abbey Guilliat and Rachelle LaFontaine, 2 points each.

Monday, Oct. 17 has us traveling to St. Peter's in Richmond; no game on Wednesday the 19th. Our last game of regular season play will be on Monday, October 24 at ST/MCA (which plays at St. Edward-on-the Lake in Lakeport). Then: tournaments! The JV tournament will be held at St. Peter School in Richmond, beginning on Thursday Oct. 27; Holy Cross is the host of the Varsity tournament, with the first games to be played on Tuesday, Nov. 1. Once a month, Holy Cross School students and families have the opportunity to help local needy people by participating in our monthly food drive. Students are invited to bring nonperishable food items to mass on the second Friday of each month; the food will be donated to the Holy Cross Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. The pantry needs our ongoing help—the bad economy hits the needy especially hard. Tomorrow is the second Friday of the month: time for our October food drive.

Can you help? The pantry is still in need of breakfast foods (cereal, pancake mix and syrup, breakfast bars,...) and pasta sauce/macaroni and cheese; they always need canned protein foods like tuna, peanut butter, hash, or canned ham or chicken, as well as fruits.
