A Little Creepy but Not Your Fault!

We have heard that a local public school has had a visit from head lice. Head lice are NOT an indicator of poor hygiene: the little critters actually prefer clean hair. But they do spread easily if not stopped.

Please be on the alert: the most common symptom is itchiness. Check your child's hair for the "nits" (eggs) tiny, white ovals stuck onto the shaft of hair near the scalp (they may look like dandruff but, unlike dandruff flakes, you can't remove them by just shaking, brushing or washing them off). The adults are about the size of a sesame seed and can be tan, brown or grev. They don't fly or jump, but can crawl pretty quickly. Part your child's hair into small sections and check on the scalp. behind the ears and at the nape of the neck. Check, also, for marks on the scalp from scratching.

Treatments for lice can be found at such places as Kmart and drug stores (and the school office has a few manufacturer's coupons for one product!). A child with head lice must remain out of class until the principal inspects his hair to be sure all adults and nits are gone.

Caution your children about sharing brushes, combs, hats or head gear: these are good ways to invite the little pests into your life!
