Once a month, Holy Cross School students and families have the opportunity to help local needy people by participating in our monthly food drive. Students are invited to bring nonperishable food items to mass on the second Friday of each month; the food will be donated to the Holy Cross Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Our local St. Vincent de Paul food pantry needs our ongoing help-the bad economy hits the needy especially hard. Next week is the second Friday of the month: time for our monthly nonperishable food drive to restock the pantry.

Can you help? The pantry is still in need of breakfast foods (cereal, pancake mix and syrup, breakfast bars,...) and pasta/macaroni and cheese; they always need canned protein foods like tuna, peanut butter, hash, or canned ham or chicken, as well as fruits. Our hungry neighbors thank you-and remember: "whatever you do to the least of My brothers, that you do to Me."
