SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE

So far this school year, the teachers and staff have been monitoring the compliance of the children with regards to the school uniform policy. We want to thank the parents for making sure that they are in the correct clothes. Good job, parents! Please check to see that the socks are the correct color: plain navy, black or white for boys and plain navy or white for girls. Although the length of the sock in the Dress Code reads crew or full length, as long as the sock covers the ankle bone, the child is considered to be in uniform. (People seem to be having a hard time finding crew socks in the stores.) The key here is that the ankle bone must be covered in order for the child to be considered in uniform. If your child's grade is not scheduled for testing but you'd like him checked, please contact the school office.
