Iowa Testing

...begins next Monday and will be completed by Oct. 12. Students will NOT be taking the tests every day within that period: their teachers will time the parts of the tests so that they interfere as little as possible with students' typical school schedule, and will usually not take more than one test in any one day.

lowa tests are nationally-normed standardized tests based on the Common Core 21st Century Standards. Our school's results will be used to identify strengths and weaknesses in both our curriculum and individual students' skills, which will help us hone our instruction to the children's needs. This test-taking also provides good practice for tests such as the SAT and ACT when students are in high school.

Your child's best test preparation is a good night's sleep and proper nutrition.
