#### BACK TO SCHOOL!

The first day of school for students in grades K-8 will be **Wednesday**, **August 26.** It will be a regular school day: full day, uniforms, with the bell welcoming you at **7:30am**. We will have classes on Thursday & Friday (Aug. 27 & 28) and Monday through Thursday (Aug. 31 and Sep. 1-3) as well.

On Monday, August 31, preschool starts (8:30am). Preschool remains scheduled at Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:30-11am. Preschoolers do not need to wear a school uniform, and there are no supplies to purchase for them. We're looking forward to getting to know you all!!

A heads-up for the 2015-16 school year: our school day will begin at **7:30am and finish at 2:50pm.** This will mesh better with both East China busing and CMC's schedule, and allow for a few more minutes of classes and lunch.

Chartwell's will be serving lunch beginning on our first day. Lunches will cost \$2.35 this year (milk is still 50¢).

Good news for East China bus riders: no more leaving school at 2:05!! (As always, please contact the bus garage to find out details concerning your stops and times.) Good news, also, for families with CMC siblings: since we'll be getting out at about the same time CMC dismisses, there will be no "study hall" this year.

A reminder to East China bus riders: East China schools will not be in session until after Labor Day, so there will be NO East China buses until Tuesday, September 8.

## Crusader Day

Monday, August 24 is the secondever "Crusader Day." (Last year was the first and it was such a success we plan to continue the new tradition!) Beginning at 9am on "Crusader Day," you can come to the Activity Center to get your school picture taken. You'll also be able to sign up for service credits, talk to PTO or School Committee members, pick up forms, and check out your classroom!

When you get your school picture taken on the 24<sup>th</sup>, please be advised that proofs won't be available. They should, however, be ready to go home with students by the 31<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Medications**

If your child will need to take medication of any sort at school, please call for a *Medication Release form*, have it completed and return to school with the medication.

The Archdiocese of Detroit requires that a doctor's signature accompany your request for the school to administer ANY type of medication: including overthe-counter medicines and cough drops—please contact your doctor now, before the need arises, if you want your student to have access to those things at school.

# "How Am I Getting Home Today?"

Younger students and their teachers will appreciate it if you send a note to school by the first day to let us know how they'll be getting home those first few days, as well as letting us know what their typical "go-home" routine will be.

#### Free and Reduced Cost Lunches

Returning students who were qualified to receive free or reduced cost lunches on the last day of school last year will remain eligible for the first few weeks of school, but will need to reapply for benefits for this year. Forms are available now in the school office, and will be available at "Crusader Day." (The application is also available at East China School District's offices and website.)

If you are transferring into Holy Cross and received free or reduced price lunches elsewhere, please contact Mrs. Steinmetz in the office ASAP so we can try to get your lunch tickets in before the first day of school.

Also, the 2015-16 service credit sign up book is available—stop in at the school office to select your credits.

# Doing Our Part

Enclosed is your August tuition statement. If there are no charges on the statement, your student is NOT yet registered! (If that's the case, please get that paperwork in ASAP!!)

Fees for the 2015-16 school year should have been paid at registration; you should have just made your third 10% tuition payment at the end of July, and your fourth payment is due at the end of August. (Please call Mrs. Steinmetz in the school office if you have any questions.)

## LATE FEES

Just as it's crucial to your household's operation to have your paycheck on time, it's crucial to the school that its tuition "paychecks" are received in a timely manner.

The school handbook and tuition contract prescribe late fees and other sanctions. Please keep your monthly payments timely so you won't feel those unpleasant consequences. Thanks!

# Financial Aid

Congratulations to the 16 students (and their families) who are receiving the Archdiocese of Detroit's tuition grant for this school year! You should have received a letter notifying you of your award. (The grant itself won't arrive until this fall: usually by the first part of November.)

Families who are receiving help from the Fr. Bartone fund will find a letter enclosed. Those grants will appear as credits on their tuition statements after the second semester of the school year begins.

# Attention New Students and Soon-To-Be Seventh Graders:

The Health Department re-assesses the immunization records of all new students and students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Summer is a great time to check with your health care provider to see if your children's shots are up to date.

Beginning this year, parents who opt not to immunize are required to contact the Health Department for a new certified waiver. (They are no longer available at schools.) The St. Clair County Health Department's phone number is 810.987.5300.

### Meningococcal Vaccine

We are required to notify you of the availability of the meningococcal vaccine. Please contact the Health Department or your doctor's office for more information.

# Girls Interested in Playing Basketball this fall--

Please contact the school office! (Oops: we forgot to put out a signup sheet before school got out for summer!) Practices should be beginning NEXT WEEK—get that physical taken care of before the season starts!

## **Student Athletes**

All students planning to participate in any school sports this year will need a sports physical before practices begin. (Blank forms were included in your "summer study packet" for eligible students, and are also available on the school website or in the school office.) Summer is a great time to get that taken care of—and you could take this opportunity to double-check your immunization status, too!

If your doctor doesn't do sports physicals, try such places as "Minute Clinics" or "Prompt Care"s. Also, St Clair County Health Department's Teen Health Center also offers them: call 810.987.1311 for more info.

(Remember: you need to have already had the physical--and sent the completed form to school--before practice for your sport begins.)

## A Few Clarifications...

- 3. "Yoga pants" are NOT approved under either the regular school dress code or the dress down day dress code.

## Annual Pest Control Advisory Notification for Parents

In keeping with the State of Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451 of 1994 and Regulation 637, Holy Cross School has adopted a plan of action for controlling insects, rodents and other pests in and around our facilities.

The school's plan of action for controlling pests incorporates integrated pest management (IPM). IPM utilizes various means of pest control including, but not limited to, habitat modification and sanitation, mechanical control, biological control and chemical control.

Holy Cross School realizes that the use of chemicals can be harmful to the health and safety of humans and the environment; therefore, we will apply chemicals only as a last resort.

If you wish to be notified before a scheduled pest treatment, please complete the form at the end of this newsletter and return to the school office.

#### **Asbestos**

Federal law requires schools to inspect, test and identify known or suspected asbestos containing building materials. Holy Cross School's last 6-month inspection took place in 2012. Since then, all asbestos containing materials were safely removed from the school building by a professional abatement company.
