We ask that each student bring the part of the feast assigned to his class: Preschool: 1 gallon of milk each Kindergartners: 1 pound of butter each

1<sup>st</sup> grade: 2 boxes of stuffing mix each 2<sup>nd</sup> grade: 2 big boxes of

- 2<sup>nd</sup> grade: 2 big boxes of orange gelatin 3<sup>rd</sup> grade: 1 apple pie & whipped cream
- 4<sup>th</sup> grade: 1 pumpkin pie & whipped cream

5<sup>th</sup> grade: will be making deviled eggs--Mrs. Wade will let you each know what to bring

6<sup>th</sup> grade: 2 dozen dinner rolls each

7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grades: cleaned and cut celery or carrots for a relish tray

(If your teacher doesn't specify the date, the food items can come to school on Thursday, Nov. 19.)

We will be looking for donations of turkeys (cooked at home, cut up and sent to school on the 20<sup>th</sup>-with drippings, please!): if you can help, please call school: 810.765.3591.
