## Thanksgiving Feast

Our annual school Thanksgiving feast is scheduled for Friday, Nov. 20. The feast is a long-standing Holy Cross custom: all the classes help to prepare the meal in some way, and then we all sit down together to share in the feast. It typifies the "family" aura that we are so blessed to enjoy at Holy Cross! But it does require a little planning.....

We ask that each student bring the part of the feast assigned to his class: Preschool: 1 gallon of milk each Kindergartners: 1 pound of butter each 1st grade: 2 boxes of stuffing mix each 2nd grade: 2 big boxes of orange gelatin 3rd grade: 1 apple pie & whipped cream 4th grade: 1 pumpkin pie & whipped cream

5<sup>th</sup> grade: will be making deviled eggs--Mrs. Wade will let you each know what to bring

6<sup>th</sup> grade: 2 dozen dinner rolls each 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grades: cleaned and cut celery or carrots for a relish tray
